



## **Business Advisory Council Plan 2019-2020**

### **Purpose of the Business Advisory Council (BAC)**

As per O.R.C. 3313.82 & O.R.C. 3313.821, BAC's foster cooperation among schools, businesses and the communities they serve. This work ensures that the work of educators aligns with the needs of businesses. This cooperation can make a local education system more aware of the local labor market; promote work-based experiences within businesses; and help students prepare for successful learning and employment opportunities.

The Preble County Educational Service Center (ESC) BAC has collaborated with the Preble County Workforce Development Committee to address the current and future employment needs of businesses throughout the county. From the business perspective, the purpose of collaboration is to make students aware of the career opportunities they have in their hometowns. From an educational perspective, we see the value in having a strong business presence in our local communities and schools. By having the business presence it exposes students to options they may not know exist otherwise.

The Preble County ESC Business Advisory Council meets quarterly to address any changes that are occurring in the economy and job market as well as work with the Workforce Development Committee to plan events, activities and programs to address the needs of both students and businesses in Preble County. Employment skills needed, as well as the development of that curriculum, will be provided by a collaboration between Miami Valley Career Technology Center, OhioMeansJobs, Edison State, Sinclair and Preble County school districts discussing and looking at the data that is being collected on an ongoing basis. The Assistant to the Superintendent for the Preble County ESC, with the assistance of one of the ESC board members, also on the BAC committee, report to the full Preble County ESC board on a monthly basis on the progress, findings and events that are occurring throughout the year.

**Activities, Events and Programs Planned for the 2019-2020 School Year:**

- **Senior Interviews (September)**  
-The new Career Connections Director will be sitting down with every senior in the county to discuss their interests, college/career plans, goals and steps they have taken toward their college/career goals. There will be development of action steps for each student to take to accomplish their goals.
- **Teen Leadership Conference**  
-This collaborative event over five months is designed to encourage and equip students in avenues they are already leading and prepare them for future opportunities in leadership. Students will learn about character, self leadership, innovation and entrepreneurship.
- **Career Fair (November 15, 2019)**  
-This is an event in which school districts from across the county take students to a local district to talk with multiple businesses from across the area while getting a hands-on experience with what the businesses do on a daily basis.
- **Manufacturing Day Tours (November 20, 21 & 22, 2019)**  
-During this three day event, students along with school district educators, have an opportunity to talk with various management levels, including senior level management,



about different career options and avenues that are available in their hometowns. They tour the manufacturing facilities to see the processes and products that are produced. Students get an opportunity to express interest in any business they would like through feedback forms in which they can signify if they would be interested in internships or full time employment.

- **Career Roundtables**

-During this event students will be linked with business professionals from their specific career cluster interests to have small group discussions on how to move toward their goals for their career. Business professionals will share the specific career paths they took to get to their current roles. Students will be able to ask a variety of questions during these small group discussions. Students will also learn about positions that businesses are currently looking to fill and the steps they would need to take if they want to apply.

- **Career Signing Day (TBD)**

-This event will be to specifically recognize those students who have decided to enter the workforce immediately upon graduation, similar to what school districts do with College Signing Day. For those students who have chosen this path and have been hired by a local business, there will be an event in which the business(s) will go to the school(s) and set up a table with their business paraphernalia and the student will publically “sign-on” with that specific company during a ceremony and be recognized in front of their peers.

- **Internships**

-This was a successful program last year and these opportunities have grown from the large manufacturers to now enter into local government offices and small businesses. This year it will continue and expand to be an option for other students who are interested in entering the workforce. Interns receive a mentor from their respective business that works with them throughout their internship. The OhioMeansJobs Readiness Seal criteria are used as an evaluative tool to assist the intern in development and enhancement of skills.

- **Creation of Pre-Apprenticeship/Registered Apprenticeship Programs**

-With the creation of our new Career Connections Director position, we have held apprenticeship meetings with local businesses, school districts and potential sponsors. From these meetings there will be the first registered apprenticeship programs and pre-



apprenticeship programs developed to provide additional opportunities for students and businesses.
